Prescription drug program starts mobile enrollment

TRENTON - The prescription drug assistance program, Rx4NJ, to provide needy New Jersey res-idents with free prescription


"The Rx4NJ Mobile Enrollment Center will spread the word that free or nearly free prescription medicines are just a click or call away," said Bob Franks, an Rx4NJ sponsor.

Yesterday, Rx4NJ unveiled a new tour bus outfitted with staff and computers that will cross the Garden State this summer to educate and match people with prescription assistance pro-

grams. "With this mobile enrollment center and classroom, we intend to bring our message to the grassroots and help people who would not otherwise know that they are eligible to participate in a patient assistance program that can provide them with their prescription medicine," said Bob Franks, the former U.S. congressman who heads the program.

Through its hotline and web-site Rx4NJ has already helped nearly seventy-thousand New Jersey residents enroll in one of 350 prescription assistance programs since Rx4NJ was started in January.
